## **School Policies**

## **Attendance**

#### **Absence**

Regular attendance is crucial for a student's academic success and personal growth. When a student is absent, she misses valuable lessons and schoolwork, which can impact her understanding and progress. We encourage all students to prioritize attending school and minimize absences to ensure they stay on track with their education. If your child needs to be absent due to illness or an immediate family simcha she should catch up on missed work within the next week. If she missed a test, a makeup test will be given within three days of her return to school.

#### Lateness

All students should be in their classrooms by 8:40 am. Any student who arrives late after 8:45 must get a late note from the office. If a student is chronically late, the parents will be contacted to discuss an intervention plan.

#### **Appointments**

Please try to schedule doctor and dentist appointments outside of school hours.

#### **Early Dismissal**

If your daughter needs to be picked up early, please call the office in advance or email the dismissal change to dismissal@baisyaakovam.org. If she needs to walk home alone, include written consent. The office will provide a permission slip for your daughter to present to the security guard. All students that are picked up must sign out by the front office.

#### **After School Arrangements**

Students may not plan in school to get together with a friend after school. All after-school arrangements must be made before coming to school. The office will not allow students to use the phone even if they are getting together to prepare for a siyum or project.

#### Extended absences

All planned extended absences, including those for extenuating circumstances, must be approved in advance by Mrs. Rudomin (elementary) and Mrs. Schuss (preschool).

## **Bas Mitzvah**

Becoming Bas Mitzvah is a significant and beautiful milestone for our girls. It marks the beginning of adulthood when each girl is מקבל עול מלכות שמים. To celebrate this momentous occasion we will be implementing a special Bas Mitzvah Program where the sixth graders will learn about the significance of becoming a Bas Mitzvah over the course of a few months. This program will culminate with a magnificent Bas Mitzvah Melava Malka event that will be attended by mothers and grandmothers.

For those that wish to have an individual Bas Mitzvah celebration, we ask that you choose from one of the following options. Please keep in mind that the purpose of these guidelines is that the Bas Mitzvah celebration should be "Batampte" and reflective of the beauty of the occasion.

#### Option #1

- The Bas Mitzvah will be held at school during regular hours. Parents can provide a meat or dairy lunch, from the school list of approved vendors, for the Bas Mitzvah girl and her classmates. The date should be confirmed with Miss Y Werner, the administrative assistant by calling 718-868-3232 ext 211 or emailing ywerner@baisyaakovam.org
- Please send disposable tablecloths, plates, cups, etc., for setup in a tasteful manner in their classroom. This is for the class only, family members may not attend.
- It would be beautiful for the Bas Mitzvah girl to share a brief d'var torah.

#### Option #2:

- The Bas Mitzvah celebration can be held in our school lunchroom on a Motzei Shabbos or Sunday af ternoon/evening. The date must be booked through Mrs. Tova Zern, by calling 718-868-3232 ext. 213 or tzern@baisyaakovam.org, to ensure the hall is available for the date requested.
- All classmates of the Bas Mitzvah girl are invited. Female relatives may be invited as well.
- Fathers, grandfathers, and younger brothers may attend but are asked to step out during dancing.
- All food activities, swag, and entertainment should be approved by Mrs. Leah Lieberstein, dean of students, 718-868-3232 ext. 205 or lieberstein@baisyaakovam.org.
- Cell phones or devices are not permitted; The בעלי שמחה will be communicating with the parents as needed.

#### Option #3

- A Bas Mitzvah celebration can be held outside of the school but needs to be a family-only event.
- Classmates and schoolmates cannot be invited.



## **Birthdays**

If you would like to celebrate your daughter's birthday in school, you may send in cupcakes or donuts from a bakery with a heimishe hechsher. As per our food policy, home-baked goods are not permitted. Please arrange with your daughter's Hebrew teacher a week in advance.

## Communication

The cornerstone of students' success is when parents and school work together as a team and communicate with one another.

#### **School to Home**

- A weekly newsletter is distributed on Friday which includes any pertinent information and upcoming events.
- Any reminder or important update like weather closures will be emailed and/or texted to you.
- Parent Orientation is scheduled at the beginning of the school year for you to hear from teachers about your daughter's learning goals and expectations for the year ahead.
- An introductory phone call can be expected from your daughter's teachers to provide you with an op portunity to discuss any concerns or questions you may have.
- There are two Parent-Teacher conferences scheduled during the school year to keep you informed of your daughter's progress.

#### Home to School

- It is important for you to notify your daughter's teachers of any circumstance that may affect your daughter. This can include a simcha in the family, family emergency, anticipated trips by parents, or other concern. Properly informed teachers will be able to support students with greater understanding.
- To reach a teacher, you may send a note with your daughter, leave a message with the office, or contact the teacher directly. If a teacher gives specific hours that she is available, please be considerate and keep to the time given.

\*\*Please be aware that during school hours the teachers are fully present with the students and cannot be reached. If it is an urgent matter, please contact the school secretary.

Administration is always available to discuss any questions and concerns you may have. Please leave a message with the school secretary and your call will be returned in a timely manner.



## **Dresscode**

Please adhere to the BYAM dress code and uniform policy. Light blue long sleeve polo shirt (Grades 1-3) and oxford shirt (Grades 4-8)

- White shirts may only be worn for ראש חדש and special occasions.
- Gray pleated uniform skirt that covers knees at all times.
- \*Grades 6-8 may only wear ankle length uniform skirts.
- Only knee socks or tights may be worn. Short socks and leggings are not permitted.
- Only a BYAM sweater or a plain black v-neck knitted sweater (without any words) may be worn. Eighth graders may wear their senior sweatshirt.
- Only shoes or sneakers may be worn. Floafers or slippers of any kind may not be worn.
- Hair that is longer than shoulder length must be worn in a pony. Cornrows and beads of any kind are not permitted.
- Nail polish and makeup of any kind is not permitted.

## **Drills**

Please be aware that throughout the year, the students will take part in fire, lockdown, and safety drills to ensure that the students are adequately prepared in the event of an emergency.

## Elevator

Elevators are not for student use. If your daughter needs to ride the elevator due to an injury, please send in a doctor's note.

## **Food**

### Breakfast and Lunch Program-

We are pleased to offer a breakfast and lunch program that provides nutritious, well-balanced meals our students enjoy each day. This service adds convenience for families by reducing the need for daily meal preparation.

#### Snacks

Recess snacks should be האדמה or העץ, מזונות. Snacks that are שהכל (i.e. candy) and gum are not permitted. Energy drinks are not allowed.



## Food (continued)

#### **Allergy Aware**

To protect our students that are allergic, please make sure that any snack or food sent to school do not contain any derivatives or traces of nuts. Kindly check all ingredients carefully.

#### **Cholov Yisroel**

All dairy products must be Cholov Yisroel.

#### Kashrus

All food must contain a reliable hechsher. For class parties, baked goods should be purchased from a bakery with a reliable hechsher. No home-made food should be sent.

## **Health and Wellness**

#### Illness

- Kindly refrain from sending your daughter to school if she is showing any signs of illness. Students may return to school once they have been free of symptoms and fever for at least 24 hours.
- If your daughter becomes ill during the school day, you will be promptly notified and expected to pick her up.
- If your daughter has contracted a contagious disease like coxsackie, pinworms, etc., please email <a href="mailto:frontdesk@baisyaakovam.org">frontdesk@baisyaakovam.org</a> so we can notify the families of students who may have been exposed.

#### Nits

Throughout the school year, students are checked for nits/lice. If a student has nits/lice, she may only return to school with a note from an approved lice-checker. Please call our Lice-Check Coordinator, Mrs. Chaya Steg 347-768-1310 to provide you with the names and numbers of approved lice-checkers.

#### **Medical Forms**

BYAM complies with the New York City immunization requirements. Kindly make sure your daughter's immunization is up to date.

#### **Emotional Health**

Emotional wellbeing is a key component of a child's ability to learn and thrive. Our curriculum includes social-emotional classes designed to foster this aspect of development. Additionally, if your child is experiencing any issues or concerns, please contact your daughter's teacher, as we have dedicated social workers available to provide support and assistance.



## **Homework and Tests**

#### Homework

Homework reinforces classroom learning, builds essential study habits, and fosters responsibility in students. Completing homework daily is crucial for your child's academic success, and your involvement is key. For students in Grades 1-5, we ask parents to sign their child's homework daily to stay engaged in the learning process. Junior high students are expected to sign their own homework, promoting independence and accountability.

#### **Tests**

Hebrew tests are issued on Mondays and Wednesdays and English tests on Tuesdays and Thursdays. In order for you to be fully apprised of your daughter's achievements, we ask that you look over and sign all tests. Please note that quizes can be given to students on the same day they have a test in a different subject.

## **Lost and Found**

Please label all your daughter's clothing. If your daughter loses something, please encourage her to look through the lost and found. All items left after 30 days will be deemed hefker.

## **Nit Checking**

Nit checking takes place multiple times a year beginning with the week prior to school. Please look out for the email from the PTA regarding nit checking protocols and schedule

## **Related Services**

If you have any OT, speech, or educational concerns about your daughter, please reach out to our Related Services Department. They will help assess if your child needs these services and assist you through the process.

SETSS (English educational support) providers will work with your child during English subjects only, while OT and speech therapy are scheduled at times that suit your child and her teacher. Our providers will happily collaborate with you and keep you informed about your child's progress.

Any outside therapists, tutors, or paras that will be working with your child must be approved by Mrs. Rudomin before coming to work with your daughter.



## **Siblings**

Students may not visit siblings in other grades including preschool and high school at any time, including recess time.

## **Supplies**

The supplies list for all grades can be found in the portal, on links through the email, and included in the mailing. Throughout the year, please make sure to replace any lost supplies.

## **Technology**

As mechanchos and parents, our deepest desire is for our girls to thrive and grow academically, socially, emotionally, and ברוחנית. We all know that exposure to unfiltered internet will greatly undermine the קדושה of our young and impressionable תלמידות. Evidence shows too that unrestricted internet access and engagement in social media can significantly impair a student's ability to focus and learn and have detrimental effects on a student's emotional wellbeing.

In order to protect the chinuch and safety of our תלמידות, we have instituted the following technology guidelines:

#### **Personal Devices**

BYAM elementary students may not own a cell phone or any internet capable devices including but not limited to tablets, amazon kindle, or ipod touch EVEN IF the device has a secure filter.

#### **Family Devices**

No student may access or use a family or parent's device that is not filtered. If a student needs to use a device for permissible activities such as conducting research for a project, sending homework to a friend, shopping, playing a computer game, or listening to music, it must be done under the following conditions:

- On a filtered device
- In an open area
- With parental supervision

#### Social Media

Students may not use social media at any time including but not limited to TikTok, Snapchat, Facebook, and Instagram.

#### Chats

Participation in group or class chats is prohibited. Students may not use text messaging, group chatting, or email as a means of communication with friends even from a parent's or family device.

Failure to comply with this technology policy is grounds for dismissal from the school.



## **Transportation and Dismissal**

#### **Dismissal Changes**

All dismissal changes must be made before 2:00 PM on weekdays and 10:00 AM on Fridays. To make a change, you can either call the office, dial option 6, and leave a voicemail or email dismissal@baisyaakovam. org.

#### Dismissal Procedures

Every teacher will lead her class downstairs to their appropriate dismissal spots. Students who are picked up will remain by the front desk waiting for their carpool to arrive. Students who go home by bus will be led by their teachers to their respective buses that are lined up outside the new main entrance.

#### **Bus Rules**

In order to ensure a smooth and safe ride for all, the following bus rules must be followed:

- NYC Bus (Grandpas) are for students of Grades 1-6 only. Grades 7-8 are not eligible.
- Students must be respectful to the bus drivers. Students are encouraged to say good morning/ afternoon and thank you, but not engage in lengthy conversations.
- Students must treat all students respectfully while riding the bus.
- Students must remain seated and keep hands, head, and arms in the bus and to themselves at all times.
- No garbage may be thrown down or out the window.
- Students must wait for the bus to come to a complete stop before getting on or off the bus.
- Students who do not follow the above rules will be suspended from riding the bus.

#### Carpool Pickup

Carpool cars will line up along Heyson Rd. When you arrive, the girls will be called and escorted to your car.

#### **Visitors**

- All visitors are expected to sign in by the security guard.
- When visiting the building, please honor the BYAM dress code and standards of modesty that reflect the values of our parents and school community. Our refined dress code includes properly fitting clothing, skirts that cover the knees completely, stockings worn at all times, and properly covered necklines and elbows, ensuring an overall appearance that looks polished and refined.
